future continuous with "going to"

(future progressive)

Future continuous expresses an action that will be happening at a point of time in the future.

<verb>ing = present participle

{I, he, she, it, we, you, they} will be <verb>ing #######
Q. Will {I, he, she, it, we, you, they} be <verb>ing?

{I, he, she, it, we, you, they} won't be <verb>ing
Q. Won't {I, he, she, it, we, you, they} be <verb>ing?

I'm going to be <verb>ing ###### Q. Am I going to be <verb>ing?

I'm not going to be <verb>ing Q. Am I not going to be <verb>ing?

{He, she, it} is going to be <verb>ing ######
Q. Is {he, she, it} going to be <verb>ing?

{He, she, it} isn't going to be <verb>ing ######
Q. Isn't {he, she, it} going to be <verb>ing?

{we, you, they} are going to be <verb>ing ######
Q. Aren't {we, you, they} going to be <verb>ing?

Q. Am I going to be <verb>ing?
A. Yes, I'm going to be <verb>ing.
A. No, I'm not going to be <verb>ing.

Q. Are we/you/they going to be <verb>ing?

A. Yes, we're/you're/they're going to be <verb>ing.

A. No, we're/you're/they're not going to be <verb>ing.

A. No, we/you/they aren't going to be <verb>ing.

- Q. Is he/she/it going to be <verb>ing?
- A. Yes, he<u>'s</u>/she<u>'s</u>/it<u>'s</u> going to be <verb><u>ing</u>.
- A. No, he<u>'s</u>/she<u>'s</u>/it<u>'s</u> not going to be <verb>ing.
- A. No, he/she/it is<u>n't</u> going to be <verb><u>ing</u>.
