Verb Classes in English

pasr simplex - parallel to the German Präteritum

These are the three basic verb classes in English. A few variations and irregularities exist beyond these. Based on your knowledge of English, you should be able to fill in the missing forms.

Weak

The stem stays intact and the sounds [t], [d] or [id] are suffixed to the stem. The Suffix '-ed' is the spelling for the tense marker.

Examples:

Strong

The stem undergoes ablaut (sound change). No suffix is added to the verb. The ablaut signals the change in tense.

Examples:

drive	drove
fly	
see	
come	came
drink	drank
eat	
know	
fall	
write	wrote
run	ran
break

Mixed

The stem undergoes ablaut (a feature of strong verbs) and the verb is suffixed with the sounds [t] or [d] (a feature of weak verbs).

Examples:

thought
crept
fled
kept
