
## Ä im Vokalviereck



Please note that the evidence provided in this table is in an experimental stage. The standard literature states that the segment represented by the character  $\ddot{a}$  is identical to lax  $e\left[\varepsilon\right]$ . Preliminary research, however, indicates that the sounds represented by the character  $\ddot{a}$  are phonemically different from e and consist of two segments pronounced by native speakers as tense  $\ddot{a}\left[9\right]$  and lax  $\ddot{a}\left[3\right]$ .
