Active / Passive Voice Basic Terms and Definitions

Agent:

The AGENT is the element that is performing the action of the verb. (The agent can be iden tified regardless of case or grammatical function)

The *wind* blew the leaves off the tree. Recently *someone* drove their car over the lawn. The houses were destroyed by *fire*. Many of the publications had been produced by *amateurs*. Only a few items were discussed at the meeting. (no agent)

Patient:

The **PATIENT** is any element acted on by an agent (regardless of case or grammatical function). (The agent is often missing in a passive voice construction.)

Mary sued *John* for all his worth. John is an engineer. (no patient) The boys helped their *sister* with her homework. Some *signs* were removed after the demonstration. The *mural* was created by all the students in the class. During the storm, many *cars* were abandoned on the highway.

Subject:

The SUBJECT is the grammatical element in a sentence to which the verb conjugates.

The *gardens* were damaged by the storm. The *worker* is cleaning the walkways. The *mural* was created by all the students in the class. The *members* are electing a new secretary.

Direct Object:

The **DIRECT OBJECT** is a patient expressed in the objective (accusative) case. The direct object is never in the nominative case and never follows a preposition.

The storm damaged the *trees*. The worker was cleaning the *walkways*. All the students in the class created a *mural*. The members elected *him*.

Definition of Active Voice:

The agent and the grammatical subject in a sentence are one in the same.

The *worker* cleaned the walkways. The *wind* blew the leaves off the tree. Recently *someone* drove their car over the lawn. The *administration* is reimbursing the workers. The *storm* damaged the gardens.

Passive Form of the Verb:

The **PASSIVE FORM OF THE VERB** consists of a form of be or get plus a participle.

The walkways *were cleaned* by a worker. No leaves *were blown* off the tree by the wind. My lawn *was ruined* by someone s car. The problem never *got solved*. The workers *are being reimbursed* by the administration. Our gardens *were damaged* by the storm. This film *will be seen* by millions.

Definition of Passive Voice:

The grammatical subject of a sentence is *NOT* the agent, *AND* the verb is in its passive form. (The subject is highlighted in each, the passive verbs are underlined.)

The *walkways* <u>were cleaned</u> by a worker. No *leaves* <u>were blown</u> off the tree by the wind. My *lawn* <u>was ruined</u> by someone s car.

The *workers* <u>are being reimbursed</u> by the administration. Our *gardens* <u>were damaged</u> by the storm.
